## Defining moments in history

**Archives Unbound** answers the call within libraries and university departments for small digitised collections of primary source material. This new online resource digitises the most sought-after microfilm collections from Gale and Primary Source Media, capturing defining moments in history from the creation of the East German state to JFK's handling of the Cuban missile crisis. Between 5,000 to 200,000 pages per title, these specialist collections act as small adjuncts to the large Gale digital collections making them an affordable option for libraries and departments.

These archives are subject-specific and support multi-disciplinary research in history, political science, hard science and ethnic studies and can be purchased on a title by title basis or in any combination.

A very active publishing schedule drives *Archives Unbound*: state-of-the-art technology enables Gale to publish multiple collections quickly. The first release alone sees the digitisation of 15 microfilm collections with many more titles planned for subsequent releases.

## Popular microfilm titles digitised

### ***Alexander III and the Policy of "Russification," 1883-1886***

This collection, as seen through the eyes of the British diplomatic corps in Russia, provides a unique analysis of the "retro-reform" policy, including the spread of pan-Slavism, both in the Russian Empire and Eastern Europe

### ***East Germany from Stalinization to the New Economic Policy, 1950-1963***

Through instructions and dispatches to and from U.S. diplomatic and consular personnel, this digital collection provides an in-depth look into the creation of the East German state, its living conditions and its people.

### ***Federal Response to Radicalism in the 1960s***

Explore the internal organisation, personnel and activities of some of the most prominent American radical groups and their movements to change government and society, including the Black Panther Party, Malcolm X and the Muslim Mosque Inc., the Socialist Workers Party, and Cuban groups supporting Fidel Castro.

### ***Federal Surveillance of African Americans, 1920-1984***

A revealing look into the records of Socialists, Communists, pacifists, militant labor unionists, ethnic or racial nationalists and those deemed politically suspect — and how far the Justice Department and FBI went to compile them.

### ***Feminism in Cuba, 1898-1958***

Compiled from Cuban sources, this collection sheds light on Cuban feminism, women in politics, literature by Cuban women and the legal status of women in Cuba, from Cuban independence to the Batista regime.

### ***Foreign Relations between Latin America and the Caribbean States, 1930-1944***

Country by country, issue by issue, this collection sheds light on the political, social and economic interactions between Central American and South American countries — including the Caribbean, Cuba, Haiti and the Dominican Republic.

### ***Global Missions and Theology***

Through pivotal personal narratives, organizational records and biographies of the essential leaders, simple missionaries and churches, this collection provides unparalleled insight into nineteenth century religious missionary activities and practices.

### ***Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees: The West***

Explores the IGCR — organised in London in 1938 following the Evian Conference, which had been called by President Roosevelt to consider the problem of racial, religious and political refugees.

### ***JFK's Foreign Affairs and International Crises, 1961-1963***

This fascinating collection provides insight into President Kennedy's views and actions on The Bay of Pigs, support of Third World countries, nuclear weapons and testing, NATO and the Multilateral Force in Europe, and the international space race.

### ***Overland Journeys: Travels in the West, 1800-1880***

For settlers, the American frontier was either a wretched ordeal or an emboldening adventure. Explore the daily events, joys and tragedies recorded by these men and women through personal, picturesque accounts.

### ***Policing the Shanghai International Settlement, 1894-1945***

This collection provides researchers with the opportunity to explore a unique period in China's struggle towards modernity through the International Settlement in Shanghai.

### ***The Economy and War in the Third Reich, 1933-1944***

Explore detailed data on the German economic situation, during the Third Reich up to and throughout World War II, through this official statistical source. Based on these economic publications: *Monatliche Nachweise-ber den Auswartigen Handel Deutschlands* (January 1933-June 1939); *Der Aussenhandel Deutschlands Monatliche Nachweise* (July 1939); and *Sondernachweis der Aussenhandel Deutschlands* (August 1939-1944).

### ***U.S. and Iraqi Relations: U.S. Technical Aid, 1950-1958***

Prior to the Revolution of 1958, the programme of technical cooperation in Iraq was frequently cited as an example of the ideal Point Four program. This collection chronicles the success and "failure" of American technical assistance.

### ***Witchcraft in Europe and America***

With transcripts of trials and exorcisms, anti-persecution writings, legal and church documents, exposes of persecutions and more, this collection includes 15th century through early 20th century text. The majority of texts are in Latin, English and German, although there are also selected items in French, Italian, Portuguese, Danish, Dutch and Spanish.

### ***Women's Issues and Their Advocacy Within the White House, 1974-1977***

With meeting minutes, briefing papers, correspondence, talking points, draft presidential remarks, speeches, newsclippings and more this collection documents the evolution of The Special Assistant to the President for Women.
