Encyclopedia of the Great Depression

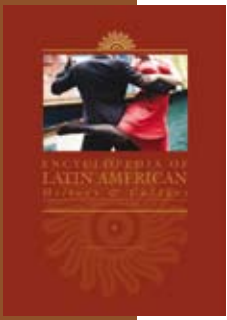
