

# New *ECCO* Interface

*The new ECCO features a powerful new user interface with increased functionality.*

## Home Page:

- A statement summarising the content in ECCO and how it can be searched
- Links to the new Research Tools section
- Search *ECCO* directly from the home page - by keyword, author, title or entire document and the included option of cross-searching with Early English Books Online (EEBO). Please note the ECCO/EEBO cross-search is only applicable to institutions subscribing to both resources.
- Added options to limit searchers by year of publication or by selected subject areas

## Advanced search page

- Enter search term and full text search by:
  - Keyword
  - Author
  - Title
  - Front matter
  - Main text
  - Back of book
  - Publisher
  - Place of publication
  - Document number
  - ESTC number

Limit search by year of publication, by one or selection of subject areas, or by languages including Dutch, Spanish, Portuguese, Italian, German and French

- Limit search to either ECCO Part 1 or Part 2

## Browse Authors and Browse by Title pages:

- Allows users to browse content as an alternative to predetermined searching
- Enter full name or part of name of author or work, cross-search with EEBO and/or limit by subject area

## Create your own Account:

Personalise your own search experience of ECCO by creating your own user account which enables you to save searches across sessions:

- Save lists of marked items and create your own named folders for them
- Select most important searches from your search history and save them in your own named folders
- Notepad – write your own comments and notes on documents viewed and save across sessions
