SOME EXAMPLES OF TITLES NEWLY AVAILABLE

Slavery/Colonialism:

In ECCO 2, more than 150 new titles have been added with ‘Slavery’ in the title of the work

Example: New title from Mrs Penelope Aubin, adding to the 17 by her in ECCO 1, narrating the story of ‘Lucinda - an English lady, her courageous and undaunted behaviour at sea, in an engagement wherein she was taken by a rover of Barbary, and sold a slave at Constantinople

Literature:

- Includes 96 new editions of Shakespeare
- A unique edition of Allan Ramsay’s ‘Above nine hundred Scots proverbs’ (Glasgow, 1781, from the Bodleian Library)

Religion and Philosophy:

- A new author (Joseph Fox) appears with his ‘Parish Clerk’s vade mecum’ – suggested readings and psalm manual for Church of England services, arising from his work as parish clerk at St. Margaret’s, Westminster. This is a Joseph Fox new to ECCO, not to be confused with the writer of the same name whose many Romances appear in ECCO 1.
- New in ECCO 2 - and the only copy in all ECCO - of ‘Petit Code de la raison humaine’, given a London imprint, but probably printed in Paris, and dedicated to Benjamin Franklin (copy from the Library of Congress)

Women’s writing:

- ECCO 2 contains 944 new works and editions by 433 women authors

Law

- ECCO 2 offers 320+ new titles concerned with or reporting trials
- For those working on the history of print, ECCO II includes a second Dublin printing in 1793 of the ‘Genuine account of the life and trial of Eugene Aramconvicted at York Assizes’. This succeeds the first 1759 Dublin printing, showing continuing local interest. Aram was convicted and hanged for murdering one Clark who had ‘unlawful commerce’ with Aram’s wife.

Music

- A unique example of a Cambridge concert programme in 1795 (from the British Library)

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
